The Chi-Rho is the oldest known monogram of Jesus Christ. It is sometimes known as a "Christogram". The *chi* and the *rho* are the first two letters of the word Christ (*Christos*) in the Greek language. The *chi* (X) = ch and the *rho* (P) = r. The Greek word *christos* translates the Hebrew word for "Messiah," which means "anointed one." Jesus was born to be the promised anointed Priest and King.

LORD'S SUPPER

We observe Communion, or the Lord's Supper, weekly in our midst.

We believe it is worthily received by those who:

- 1. Have been baptized in the name of the Triune God (Matt 28:18-20);
- 2. Do profess faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and Savior of sinners, and do rest upon Him alone for salvation as He is offered in the Gospel (Ro 10:9-10);
- 3. Do live in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit and endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Jesus Christ (Gal 5:16-26); and
- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)

If these things are all true, we rejoice with you and invite you to commune with us at the Lord's Supper. If any of these are not true of you, we ask that you refrain. We invite you to speak to one of the Elders if you have doubts or questions regarding any of these beliefs, or if you are interested in learning more about Trinity.

Though collections are not ordinarily taken during a service, giving is a vital element of worship. Tithes and offerings may be placed in the basket at the rear of the church.

<u>Heidelberg Catechism Pt 2 Deliverance:</u> <u>The Holy Supper of Jesus Christ - Lord's Day 30</u>

Q 80. How does the Lord's Supper differ from the Roman Catholic Mass?

A. The Lord's Supper declares to us that all our sins are completely forgiven through the one sacrifice of Jesus Christ, which he himself finished on the cross once for all. It also declares to us that the Holy Spirit grafts us into Christ, who with his true body is now in heaven at the right hand of the Father where he wants us to worship him. But the Mass teaches that the living and the dead do not have their sins forgiven through the suffering of Christ unless Christ is still offered for them daily by the priests. It also teaches that Christ is bodily present under the form of bread and wine where Christ is therefore to be worshiped. Thus the Mass is basically nothing but a denial of the one sacrifice and suffering of Jesus Christ and a condemnable idolatry.

Q 81. Who should come to the Lord's table?

- A. Those who are displeased with themselves because of their sins, but who nevertheless trust that their sins are pardoned and that their remaining weakness is covered by the suffering and death of Christ, and who also desire more and more to strengthen their faith and to lead a better life. Hypocrites and those who are unrepentant, however, eat and drink judgment on themselves.
- Q 82. Should those be admitted to the Lord's Supper who show by what they profess and how they live that they are unbelieving and ungodly?
- A. No, that would dishonor God's covenant and bring down God's wrath upon the entire congregation. Therefore, according to the instruction of Christ and his apostles, the Christian church is duty-bound to exclude such people, by the official use of the keys of the kingdom, until they reform their lives.

Psalm 48 (tune: Diademata, "Crown Him with many Crowns")

Great is the LORD our God, and greatly to be praised. Upon a hill God's city stands in glorious beauty raised-his holy mountain high, the city of our King, the joy of all the earth below. In praise of God we sing.

God makes his city strong by living in her halls. When kings join forces and advance, they marvel at her walls. God scatters those around whose pride makes them so sure. As we have heard, so have we seen: God's city is secure.

Within your temple, LORD, in your most holy place, We on your lovingkindness dwell, the wonders of your grace. Your people sing your praise where'er your name is known; by every deed your hand has done your righteousness is shown.

Let Zion now rejoice and all her people sing; let them with thankfulness proclaim the judgments of their King. Mount Zion's walls behold, about her ramparts go, and number all the lofty towers that guard her from the foe.

Observe her palaces, mark her defenses well, that to the children following you her glories you may tell. For God as our own God forever will abide, and till life's journey close in death will be our faithful guide.
