LORD'S SUPPER

We observe Communion, or the Lord's Supper, weekly in our midst.

We believe it is worthily received by those who:

1. Have been baptized in the name of the Triune God (Matt 28:18-20);
2. Do profess faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and Savior of sinners, and do rest upon Him alone for salvation as He is offered in the Gospel (Ro 10:9-10);
3. Do live in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit and endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Jesus Christ (Gal 5:16-26); and
4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)

If these things are all true, we rejoice with you and invite you to commune with us at the Lord's Supper. If any of these are not true of you, we ask that you refrain. We invite you to speak to one of the Elders if you have doubts or questions regarding any of these beliefs, or if you are interested in learning more about Trinity.

Though collections are not ordinarily taken during a service, giving is a vital element of worship. Tithes and offerings may be placed in the basket at the rear of the church.

Heidelberg Catechism Review

Part 2 Deliverance: Lord's Day 5,

- Q 12. *According to God's righteous judgment we deserve punishment both now and in eternity: how then can we escape this punishment and return to God's favor?*
- A. God requires that his justice be satisfied. Therefore the claims of this justice must be paid in full, either by ourselves or by another.
- Q 13. *Can we make this payment ourselves?*
- A. Certainly not. Actually, we increase our debt every day.
- Q 14. *Can another creature—any at all—pay this debt for us?*
- A. No. To begin with, God will not punish any other creature for what a human is guilty of. Furthermore, no mere creature can bear the weight of God's eternal wrath against sin and deliver others from it.
- Q 15. *What kind of mediator and deliverer should we look for then?*
- A. One who is a true and righteous human, yet more powerful than all creatures, that is, one who is also true God.
