No symbol can adequately comprehend the richness of the reality and abundant life of our Triune God. This shield depicts something of the Unity in Trinity and Trinity in Unity that is the living and true God in whom we trust. At the center is Deus (Latin for "God). Reading out from the center along the three spokes, the unity of the Godhead is represented: Deus est Pater = God is the Father and the Father is God; Deus est Filius = God is the Son and the Son is God; Deus est Spiritus Sanctus = God is the Holy Spirit and the Holy Spirit is God. Reading around the circumference of the circle, the distinctions between the Persons are noted: Pater non est Filius = The Father is not the Son; Filius non est Spiritus Sanctus = The Son is not the Holy Spirit; Spiritus Sanctus no est Pater = The Holy Spirit is not the Father.

We observe Communion, or the Lord's Supper, weekly in our midst.

We believe it is worthily received by those who:

- 1. Have been baptized in the name of the Triune God (Matt 28:18-20);
- 2. Do profess faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and Savior of sinners, and do rest upon Him alone for salvation as He is offered in the Gospel (Ro 10:9-10);
- 3. Do live in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit and endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Jesus Christ (Gal 5:16-26); and
- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)

If these things are all true, we rejoice with you and invite you to commune with us at the Lord's Supper. If any of these are not true of you, we ask that you refrain. We invite you to speak to one of the Elders if you have doubts or questions regarding any of these beliefs, or if you are interested in learning more about Trinity.

Though collections are not ordinarily taken during a service, giving is a vital element of worship. Tithes and offerings may be placed in the basket at the rear of the church. (2 Corinthians 9:6-11)

Sermon Notes – September 27, 2015

"Of Church Councils"

1.	Should there be greater assemblies of the Church beyond the local congregations? A. For the better, and further of the Church, there can be such assemblies, commonly called councils. It is within the Christ-given power of the elders of the particular churches, to convene such assemblies as as they judge it expedient for the good of the Church (Acts 15:2,4,6).
2.	What do such assemblies and councils do? A. They act as a higher of the Church: to determine controversies of faith and cases of conscience; to give directions for the better ordering of the public worship of God and government of His Church; to receive and authoritatively settle complaints about poor administration in particular churches. (Acts 15:2,4,6,19,24,27-31; 1 Co 6:1)
3.	Is the work of Church councils normative, ie made the standard for the churches? A. All assemblies or councils, since the Apostles' times may err, and many have erred. Therefore they are not to be made the rule of or, but are to be used as a help in both. (Ep 2:20; Acts 17:11; 2 Co 1:24; 1 Co 2:5)
4.	What is the jurisdiction of Church councils? A. Ministers who gather in council are not to stray from their ecclesiastical sphere. They are not to meddle in partisan politics unless the situation is extraordinary, and even then they must remember their and only express themselves in great humility. (Lu 12:13-14; Jn 18:36; 1 Co 5:12)
