- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)



Scripture Memory

Our Scripture memory text is Colossians 1:13-23. This week memorize v 15:

He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.

Notes: The phrase, *firstborn over all creation*, is used by some to teach that Jesus was the first created being, and hence not the eternal God. But in the OT, "firstborn" is a term of honor, referring to the heir of an estate (Deut 21:17; Ps 89:27). Joseph was not the oldest son of Jacob, but he received the "firstborn" double portion of Jacob's possessions. His tribal inheritance was doubled so that both his sons, Manasseh and Ephraim, received a tribal portion with the other tribes of Israel. Jesus is one with the Father. He is the beloved, eternally begotten Son of God, heir of all things
