- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)



Scripture Memory

Our Scripture memory text is Colossians 1:13-23. This week memorize v 16:

For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him.

Note: V 16 is organized as a chiasm, to emphasize that Christ is both the agent and goal of all creation. V 16 explains v 15, how Christ bears the *firstborn* honor *over all creation* as the Creator and Lord of all things *visible and invisible*. Wind, air, breath, spirit are invisible, but Paul has the angelic realm particularly in mind--*thrones, dominion, principalities...* Paul instructs the Colossae saints that they should not worship angels or other invisible powers (Col 2:18), but that it is only [and absolutely] necessary to worship Christ, *the image of the invisible God* who is Creator-Lord of all *visible and invisible* things. The question then was not whether there was an invisible God, but Who is He? But the *invisible* parts of creation imply that there can be [is] an invisible God.
