- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)



Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.

Notes: To mourn is not to murmur or complain. Nor is Jesus talking about mourning in general, as one would sorrow over the death of a loved one. The context that the *poor in spirit* are blessed with Christ's kingdom indicates this mourning is over spiritual matters of my sin and the evil that is in the world. Comfort comes from the assurance of God's forgiveness of our sin because *Christ was raised for our justification*. Comfort comes knowing that Jesus is the reigning King, conquering all His and our enemies.
