- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)



We invite you to speak to one of the Elders if you have doubts or questions regarding any of these beliefs, or if you are interested in learning more about Trinity.

Scripture Memory

Scripture memory: Our text is Matthew 5:1-12. This week review v 1-5 and memorize v 6:

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled.

Notes: In Mary's Magnificat, she says the Lord "has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich He has sent away empty" (Lu 1:53). Jesus said to the Pharisees, "I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners, to repentance" (Lu 5:31). The Lord fills up the humble and justifies them (Lu 18:9-14), because they seek righteousness from the Lord and do not trust in their own. God has created us with hunger and thirst, both physical and spiritual. Does your soul thirst for God? Do you seek first His righteousness (Mt 6:33)? If you are thirsty, drink from His Word. If you are hungry, eat His Word, and your thoughts and ways will be changed and conformed to His thoughts and ways (Isa 55:1,6-9).
