- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)

If these things are all true, we rejoice with you and invite you to commune with us at the Lord's Supper. If any of these are not true of you, we ask that you refrain. We invite you to speak to one of the Elders if you have doubts or questions regarding any of these beliefs, or if you are interested in learning more about Trinity.



#### **Scripture Memory**

Our text is Matthew 5:1-12. This week review v 1-7 and memorize v 8:

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God.

Notes: Jesus may have had Ps 24:3-6 in mind with this beatitude: Who may ascend into the hill of the LORD? Or who may stand in His holy place? He who has clean hands and a pure heart...He shall receive blessing from the LORD...who seek Your face. The Psalmist exhorts us to pure thoughts and actions, but "being" must precede "doing." Only the pure, holy, harmless, undefiled God can cleanse and purify a sinner from the defilement of his sin. Only then can we stand righteous before God and "see" Him face to face. Being pure or becoming pure is accomplished by His mercy. He saves us, through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit. Then, we can purify our souls in obeying the truth (1 Pe 1:22), and one day we shall see God (1 Jn 3:2).
