If these things are all true, we rejoice with you and invite you to commune with us at the Lord's Supper. If any of these are not true of you, we ask that you refrain. We invite you to speak to one of the Elders if you have doubts or questions regarding any of these beliefs, or if you are interested in learning more about Trinity.



Scripture memory text: Galatians 5:13-26. This week review v 13-15; memorize v 16:

I say then: Walk in the Spirit, and you shall not fulfill the lust of the flesh.

A "walk" indicates moving in a direction continuously, a way of life, a lifestyle. Our Christian walk is to be "in the Spirit" not in "the flesh." "Flesh" does not refer here to the physical body, as though we should try to live in an out-of-body existence. Rather, "flesh" refers to our sinful human nature and "Spirit" refers to the opposite, i.e. a God-like lawful, loving nature (see vs 13-15). Psalm 1 is a good commentary on contrasting the antithesis between walking in the Spirit and in the flesh.
