- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)



The Decline of Judah, the Rise of Empire & the Reign of Christ, pt 2 Text: 2 Kings 16

Intro: Warnings from the Apostasy of Ahaz & the Temptations of Empire

- 1. Ahaz is unfaithful to Yahweh by encouraging moral ______ in Judah (2 Ch 28:19)
 - A. He is unlike *righteous David* and a reproach to the lineage of Messiah (1-2)
 - B. He is unreasonably like the idolatrous *kings of Israel* having no instigation (3; 2 Ch 28:2)
 - C. He is like the heathen imitating their *abominations*, dedicating his son to idols (3b)
 - D. He is unlike his father Jotham in that he sacrifices at high places (4)
- 2. Ahaz is *continually unfaithful to Yahweh* in trusting ______ to save him, while rejecting the prophetic Word of God (5-9; 2 Ch 28:19-21; Isa 7)
- 3. Ahaz is *increasingly unfaithful to Yahweh* in changing the ______ of religion and worship (2 Ch 28:22)
 - A. Ahaz is another Jeroboam in setting up an _______ *altar*, an alternative worship in place of the copies of the true, heavenly things (10-16; Ex 25:9,40; 40:16; Dt 18:9-13)
 - B. Ahaz, like Cain the architect of the city of man, devises his own *will-worship*, changing the temple décor simply to _________(17-20; 2 Ch 28:23-25; Col 2:23).

Now the works of the flesh are evident, which are: adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lewdness, idolatry, sorcery, hatred, contentions, jealousies, outbursts of wrath, selfish ambitions, dissensions, heresies, envy, murders, drunkenness, revelries, and the like;

Christ said, By their fruits ye shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thoms, or figs of thistles? So every good tree brings forth good fruit, but an evil tree brings forth evil fruit (Mt 7:16). Luther writes: "Sometimes it happens that the saints do fall, and perform the lusts of the flesh, as David and Peter did. But although these sins were great and heinous, they were not committed of contempt of God but of infirmity and weakness. Moreover they did not obstinately continue in their sin, but repented."
