- 3. Do live in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit and endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Jesus Christ (Gal 5:16-26); and
- 4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)



# JESUS IS RISEN!

# HE IS RISEN INDEED!

In the name of the risen and reigning Lord Jesus Christ welcome: to all who hunger and thirst after righteousness; to all who are spiritually weary and seek rest; to all who mourn and long for comfort; to all who struggle and desire hope; to all who sin and need a Savior; to all who are strangers and yearn for fellowship; and to whomever will come.

He rules over public worship. In corporate worship – when God meets with His people, Christ with His bride, the Spirit with His temple – we receive God's grace through the Word and sacrament, and we respond to Him with thanksgiving, faith, and love.

# Hezekiah, a New David, a New Adam Text: 2 Kings 18

- 1. Hezekiah, "whom Yahweh strengthens," is the best \_\_\_\_\_\_ like king since David.
  - A. Like David, the sovereign \_\_\_\_\_ of God worked upon him (1-3)
  - B. Like David, he \_\_\_\_\_ God, His word and His house (4-6)
  - C. Like David, he fights Philistines and resists giants for God's \_\_\_\_\_ (7-8)
- 2. Yahweh's case against northern Israel (9-12), seems to indicate the soon fall of Judah too (13-16), but as Yahweh delayed the destruction of Ahab's house, so He delays the final blow of Judah.
- 3. Hezekiah, *a king who reigns in righteousness* (Isa 32:1), is a new and better \_\_\_\_\_\_ king
  - A. He \_\_\_\_\_ the serpent fetish "Nehushtan" (4)
  - B. He \_\_\_\_\_ God's garden city of Jerusalem (2 Chr 32:1-5)
  - C. He \_\_\_\_\_ Yahweh's bride (2 Chr 32:6-8) by resisting the devilish temptations of Rabshakeh (17-37).

#### **Scripture Memory**

Scripture memory text: Galatians 5:13-26. This week review v 13-21 & memorize v 22-23:

But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law.

Luther: "Paul does not call these the 'works of the Spirit' as he had called *the works of the flesh*, for he adorns these Christian virtues [concrete behavior] by a more honorable name, *the fruit of the Spirit*: for they who have them give glory to God, and allure others to embrace the doctrine and faith of Christ. The law cannot accuse or condemn those that believe in Christ. A Christian accomplishes the law inwardly by faith; outwardly by works and remission of sins; but those who perform the works or *lusts of the flesh*, the law does accuse and condemn both civilly and spiritually."

### **Hospitality Reminder**

Regarding Romans 12:13, *pursuing hospitality*, Steve Wilkins writes: "Does God extend His hospitality "only when necessary?" Hasn't He promised it to the whole world? "If you need me, call me" is not the spirit of Christianity. We should be hosts who earnestly seek for opportunities to show love to the brethren, and who are disappointed when not able to do so. If we have love, we do not dread it or force ourselves into it. There are two different spirits here; one of them Christian, and the other pagan. One of them glorifies Christ, the other does not. Hospitality is not an option but a holy obligation. Each Christian should pursue it, even if he were the only one in an entire congregation to do so."
