We observe Communion, or the Lord's Supper, weekly in our midst.

We believe it is worthily received by those who:

1. Have been baptized in the name of the Triune God (Matt 28:18-20);
2. Do profess faith in the Lord Jesus Christ as the Son of God, and Savior of sinners, and do rest upon Him alone for salvation as He is offered in the Gospel (Ro 10:9-10);
3. Do live in humble reliance upon the grace of the Holy Spirit and endeavor to live as becomes the followers of Jesus Christ (Gal 5:16-26); and
4. Are communing members in good standing in an evangelical church (1 Cor 10:1-6)

If these things are all true, we rejoice with you and invite you to commune with us at the Lord's Supper. If any of these are not true of you, we ask that you refrain. We invite you to speak to one of the Elders if you have doubts or questions regarding any of these beliefs, or if you are interested in learning more about Trinity.

Though collections are not ordinarily taken during a service, giving is a vital element of worship. Tithes and offerings may be placed in the basket at the rear of the church. (2 Corinthians 9:6-11)

In corporate worship – when God meets with His people, Christ with His bride, the Spirit with His temple – we receive God's grace through the Word and sacrament, and we respond to Him with thanksgiving, faith, and love.

Sermon Notes – October 28, 2012

Hezekiah, Reformer King of Judah Text: 2 Chr 29, 30, 31

1. *Zeal for Your house has eaten Me up* (Jn 2:17). Hezekiah typifies Christ the _____ when he exhorts the ministers to sanctify themselves and the temple (2 Chr 29).
2. *With fervent desire I have desired to eat this Passover with you* (Lu 22:15). Hezekiah typifies Christ the _____ by interceding for unclean communicants (2 Chr 30).
3. *My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me* (Jn 4:34). Hezekiah typifies Christ the obedient _____ in devoting himself to the law of Yahweh (2 Chr 31).

Scripture Memory

Scripture memory text: Galatians 5:13-26. This week review v 13-23 and memorize v 24:

And those who are Christ's have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.

By faith, the saints crucify the flesh, by recognizing the reality of their union with Christ in His death (Gal 2:20). By faith working in love, we can "repress the wantonness of the flesh with fasting and other excesses" (Luther). Or another way to nail the flesh to the cross is "when we walk according to the Spirit: that is, when being admonished by God, where He denounces penalty for sin, we are afraid to commit sin: also, being armed with the word of God, with faith, and with prayer, we do not obey the lusts of the flesh" (Luther). When the saint dies the flesh is wholly put off, and in the resurrection we are raised incorruptible, without sinful affections and lusts.
