We confess and pray to You in Jesus' name, Amen.

Father, has had mercy on us. He has given His only Son to die for us,

and for His sake forgives us of all our sins.

People: Thanks be to God! Our sins are forgiven in Jesus' name. Amen.

Scripture Memory

Our Scripture memory text is Luke 2. This week review v 1-7 and learn v 8-9.

- 8 And there were in the same country shepherds abiding in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night.
- 9 And, lo, the angel of the Lord came upon them, and the glory of the Lord shone round about them: and they were sore afraid.

Calvin: "It would have been to no purpose that Christ was born in Bethlehem, if it had not been made known to the world. But the method of doing so, which is described by Luke, appears to the view of men very unsuitable. First, Christ is revealed but to a few witnesses, and that too amidst the darkness of night. Again, though God had, at his command, many honorable and distinguished witnesses, he passed by them, and chose shepherds, persons of humble rank, and of no account among men...we must acknowledge, that *the foolishness of God* (1 Cor 1:25) excels all the wisdom that appears to exist in the world. But this too was a part of the *emptying of himself* (Phil 2:6) not that any part of Christ's glory should be taken away by it, but that it should lie in concealment for a time.
