

In corporate worship – when God meets with His people, Christ with His bride, the Spirit with His temple – we receive God's grace through the Word and sacrament, and we respond to Him with thanksgiving, faith, and love.

Sermon Notes - December 4, 2011

"Of the Father's Love Begotten" Text: John 15:9-17

1.	Love for: the Father's love dwells in the one who is Christ's Word, but we are tempted to leave Him and love the world, therefore Christ tells us how necessary it is that we, by faith, adhere to Him and abide in Him (v 9-11; v 1-8).
2.	Love for the: Christ's love is characterized by and sacrificing, but we are tempted to grow cold, indifferent and strange to one another, therefore Christ presses us to keep up that love and communion with one another (v 12-15)
3.	Love for the: the Spirit makes us to love and bear witness of Christ to others, but we are tempted to shrink from our calling when we meet hardships, therefore Christ prepares us to bear the shock of the world's hatred (v 16-27)
