Job 13-14

1.	Job continues his answer against the friends.		
	A.	Job wants to speak to Shaddai because the friends are worthless liars, deceivers. (13:1-12)	
	B.	Because he is confident that he is blameless before God, Job is prepared and prefers to meet God in death, rather than wait for his accusers to kill him. (13:13-19)	
2.	Job speaks to God, seeking justice/vindication, whether in life or death.		
	A.	Job's two preliminary requests and questions of God (13:20-28)	
	B.	General suffering of mankind, yet a picture of resurrection hope from a tree (14:1-12)	
	C.	Job seeks change of his situation even if it means death, yet death brings its own futility that haunts him. (14:13-22)
